
WCCC Annual Program Summary FY 2017-18

Residential Work Release

WR Average Daily Population



WCWR has had 288 individual participant intakes for the program during the 2017-18 year. 83% of those have come directly from WCJ. The total annual ADP for the year is 80.

Of the 288 intakes, 83 were misdemeanors with 88% being A Misdemeanors.

199 intakes were felony charges with:

10 (5%) B Felony




Charges at Intake



The goal of successful completion or modification of sentence is often met upon exit, however, terminations occur for various reaons. During 2017-18 there were 263 exits.

Self-termination	6 (2%)


Employment Services Program




The employment services program (ESP) worked with 142 participants in 2017-18. 131 (92%) of eligible participants were successfully employed within 30 days of completing the employment program.

Forensic Diversion

The FD program has continued to service individuals in Whitley County as well as surrounding counties, and even provides case management for those out of state as ordered. The ADP reached a "low" this year of 248 individuals on active caseload, with a "high" of 280. Although there has been a slight decrease in active cases, there has been a significant increase in cases transferred to inactive status due to incarceration. This year there has also been 24 pre-trial and DPA cases referred to this program.



Home Detention



HD had 94 intakes this year with 82 (87%) being sentenced in Whitley County. 13 were courtesy supervision from other counties while 30 adult cases were transferred out of county for HD supervision.

Historically HD numbers trend down during the summer months and this year is no different. The numbers of transfers out to other counties has remained stable as has the juvenile and pre-trial numbers. 30% of HD participants were convicted of misdemeanor charges while 70% were felony convictions.

79% (81) of adult participants and 7/8 juveniles successfully completed the home detention program.




Veterans Treatment Court began

February, 2017, and has had four successful program graduates.



Veterans Treatment Court has grown significantly since opening. The average daily population has increased from 5 to 10.23 over the past twelve months.

Over the last year, total participants in Veterans Treatment Court has increased from 5 to 11, with 3 courtesy supervision cases from other counties. While the vast majority of cases remain felonies, there continues to be a small percentage of misdemeanor cases.



Community Service



The community service program continues to provide a way for offenders to give back to our community through a structured program. Traditionally, hours drop during the winter months and increase during the summer months. Throughout this past year, community service hours have contributed \$106,197.13 in labor to our communities in northeast Indiana.
